

## Lynchburg Portraits Restored

our oil portraits owned by the Museum System have just been restored by the Richmond Conservation Studio and will be placed on exhibition in August. The Morgan portrait was recently donated by the August Forsberg descendants who generously paid for the restoration.

Caroline M. Morgan, ca. 1840 (1805-1883) married James

Caroline M. Morgan, ca. 1840 (1805-1883) married James Morgan, wealthy Lynchburg tobacconist, and managed his large estate after his early demise. She is buried in Old City Cemetery.

Edward Sanford Gregory, ca. 1862 (1843-1884) joined the Lynchburg Rifles of the 11th Virginia Infantry in 1861. After the Civil War, his careers included teacher, journalist, clergyman, and published poet. He is buried in Presbyterian Cemetery.

Samuel McGregor Scott (1798-1878) and Camilla Payne Scott's (1803-1883) portraits are in matching frames and date ca. 1840. Scott inherited the Locust Thicket plantation on what is now Old Forest Road and farmed other holdings in Bedford County. He and his wife moved to Texas in 1857 and are buried in Dallas.

# New Acquisition for Point of Honor

Known as a night stool, commode chair, necessary, or close stool, these were a fixture of life in the early 19th century.

Donated by Florence and Ned Perrow, the chair will be placed in the guest bed chamber at Point of Honor.

## Laura Lembas, Whitney Roberts, and Mary Frances Pressley

n March, the Museum System welcomed Laura Lembas as curator. Laura, a native of Detroit, holds an undergraduate degree in American history and master's degree in historic preservation. She most recently worked at of the time because I was out at meetings, the Stonewall Jackson House and George Marshall Museum in Lexington.

Whitney Roberts was recently named museum educator and volunteer coordinator. Whitney was born in Lynchburg and has worked part-time for the Museum System since 2007. She has an undergraduate degree in history/anthropology and master's degree in archival studies.

The late Mary Frances Pressley was the first office manager for the Lynchburg Museum System and passed away in 2012. Former Museum Director Tom Ledford made a generous donation to the Foundation in her memory and the following is excerpted from his remembrance: "Mary Frances Pressley worked at the Museum from 1979 until she retired in 1991. It was her character and dependability

that made our early success possible and without her patience and humanity, the museum volunteer organization would have never existed.

She was at Point of Honor alone most at the Old Court House which was still under restoration, or somewhere in the community visiting donors.

When we began opening to the public, Mary Frances took on the scheduling and caretaking of the volunteers and helped me to schedule schools for living history programs. None of that would have worked without her help.

Eventually we moved into the Old Court House, where her office was on the main floor. She greeted anyone coming into the building, whether they were on museum business or just looking for the traffic court--always pleasant, always helpful. She gracefully managed every change, every disruption, and every calamity with a smile, a roll of her eyes and her neverending patience."

## Water Bearer Statue to Be Recast

ynchburg's first public artwork, The Water Bearer, was found toppled and in pieces in 2012. The zinc statue was purchased by the City and placed atop the Clay Street reservoir ca. 1880. At first thought to be vandalism, further investigation indicates that the zinc statue collapsed under its own weight, a common issue with zinc figures. Because of this fundamental flaw, the statue cannot be restored as is. While commonly known as the Greek Water Bearer, research shows that the figure has Egyptian ties with a flying sun disk headband that represents the Egyptian god Horus.

The Lynchburg Historical Foundation and the SOS (Save Outdoor Sculpture!) Committee are spearheading a project to recast the statue in bronze. Sculptor Ken Faraoni, who repaired the Listening Post statue at Monument Terrace and the 2nd Virginia Cavalry marker in Miller Park, will be coordinating the project.

The Lynchburg Museum Foundation is a partner and has donated \$3,500 to the project, estimated to cost \$35,000. Tentative plans are to place the recast bronze statue within the Lower Bluffwalk area.
