Experience The James Exhibit Opens

In June, Mayor Michael Gillette proclaimed Lynchburg's "Year of the River" in honor of Experience The James: Lynchburg's Pathway to the World. The exhibit opened in June and runs through December 2015. Over 140 Museum members and lenders to the exhibition attended the preview reception on June 5th. The City installed Experience The James banners on the John Lynch Bridge in June and a number of exciting programs are being held by the Museum and partners.



Point of Honor Update

A house that is 199 years old needs tender care and Point of Honor has been getting it in recent weeks. Trim, shutters, porches, and railings have all been painted on the main house; the Carriage House clapboard and trim were also painted.

A stone retaining wall collapsed along Cabell Street near Point of Honor this spring due to heavy rains that saturated the ground behind the wall. Public Works repaired the wall and graded the slope to direct rainwater away from the wall.

The rear garden that had become overgrown has been cleared and the Restoration Committee of the Garden Club of Virginia is developing a plan to enhance that area with low maintenance plantings and features. Thanks to Lynchburg Public Works and Buildings and Grounds for taking such good care of this historic property.
