

EXHIBITIONS IN 2016

he Experience The James exhibit closed at the end of 2015 after being viewed by over 13,000 people. From January 12-March 6, the Library of Virginia traveling exhibit: To Be Sold: Virginia and the American Slave Trade is on display. The exhibit explores the sale of large numbers of slaves from Virginia to the Deep South in the years prior to the Civil War. Included are artifacts excavated from slave quarters at Thomas Jefferson's Poplar Forest and information on Jefferson's sale of a number of slaves over the years. On loan from Sweet Briar College is a letter from a slave to Elijah Fletcher, former mayor of Lynchburg and father of the founder of Sweet Briar. The slave, Martha Penn Taylor, asks Fletcher to buy her so that she is not "sold South," which he does. Martha lived at Sweet Briar plantation as a slave and then as an employee after the Civil War.



Also included is the story of Lynchburg's Quakers as their faith abolished slavery in the 18th century. Quaker leaders determined that slavery "was an abomination in the eyes of God" and members of the faith freed their slaves or had to leave the church. Lynchburg founder John Lynch freed his slaves in 1782 and a copy of his "deed of manumission" is on display courtesy of the Campbell County Clerk's Office. In addition to Poplar Forest and Sweet Briar College, other partners include The Legacy Museum and the Martin Luther King Center for Human Rights. They and the Lynchburg Museum are sponsoring an African American genealogy workshop at the Lynchburg Public Library on February 19th from 2-4 pm followed by a program on the Library of Virginia's new searchable database "Virginia Untold: The African American Narrative." The To Be Sold exhibit will be followed by A Great Change in the Situation of Man: Lynchburg's Railroads from March 12th through the end of 2016.

Also on display is A Feast for the Eyes: Quilts and Textiles from Central Virginia, which runs through the end of 2016. Over 20 quilts, samplers, needlework, and related pieces are featured—all with a local connection. These items are from the Lynchburg Museum Collection, loaned by other museums including the Virginia Quilt Museum, Bedford Museum, Campbell County Historical Society, and Amherst Museum, or loaned by local families.
